

## COVID 19



Tabley Parish Council are currently following Government guidelines and want to remind our parishioners of the following.

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of a new continuous cough and or high temperature. If you have these symptoms, however mild, stay at home and do not leave your house for 7 days from when your symptoms started.

You do not need to call NHS 111 to go into self-isolation. If your symptoms worsen during home isolation or are no better after 7 days, contact NHS 111 online. If you have no internet access, you should call NHS 111. For a medical emergency dial 999.

Can we request that we as a caring community, keep a vigilant eye on our elderly neighbours and go that extra mile should they require any assistance with shopping etc. If the Parish Council can help anyone at this difficult time, please do not hesitate to make contact with us.

You are probably already aware that the Church of England, in line with Government advice, has decided to suspend all worship services until further notice. This is an unprecedented situation but necessary if we are to contain the outbreak and protect the most vulnerable in our society.

### **Weddings and Funerals**

Some people have asked about whether Weddings and Funerals will continue to take place.

The answer at the present time is that yes, they will. However, numbers of people attending will need to be limited and the social distancing and hygiene precautions will need to be implemented. Of course, older and 'at risk' people will no doubt take the Government's advice and not attend.

In the case of weddings, travel from other countries is not possible and relatives and friends may not be able to come. The weddings will go ahead unless the couple wish to re-organise the date, and we are offering a Blessing Service in the future when everyone can come and celebrate together.

In the case of funerals many will miss the chance to remember and give thanks for the life of someone who has been dear or special to them. We therefore plan to hold services of thanksgiving or memorial services later on when things have settled down if this is what relatives wish.

## M6 & Junction19 Improvement update

Work will be starting on the M6/Junction 19 Improvement scheme in late March 2020. During the first few weeks, the main focus of the work will be within the centre of the roundabout, making preparations to enable them to start building the foundations of the new bridge from late May onwards. Other pockets of work will be carried out at the same time.

Narrow lanes will be introduced and a reduced speed limit are required to provide a safe working space for our workers. They advise drivers to take extra care within the roadworks and allow extra time for the journey. Some closures will be required to install the traffic management. However, it was stated that they will not close the motorway and the junction at the same time.

The compound will be used as the office, for car parking, and for storage of the materials and construction equipment. The site will be required for approximately 15 months. Along with the construction activities these will inevitably cause some disruption for local residents around the junction, but they will endeavour to minimise the impact where possible. Construction activities will be supervised, keeping disturbance to a minimum, and noise levels will be monitored to ensure they do not reach an unacceptable level.
