

Letter from the Ministry Team

The second service we held in St Paul's Over Tabley after it was re-opened following the reordering was Communion and Carols on 20 December. Sadly, of course the congregation couldn't sing – just hum under their masks if they wished. At the conclusion of the service, we all went outside and, socially distanced, sang O Come All Ye Faithful. We found a way to sing which didn't contravene the Covid-19 safety rules.

The year 2020 was hard for everyone, a long and difficult journey; but If there was a theme running through 2020 it was that determination, love and care enabled people to find a way through the changes, the suffering, the struggles. At the moment the year ahead may look rather depressing and dark but there is light at the end of the tunnel of the present situation and the restrictions we have been living under.

When we had sung that carol outside St Paul's just before Christmas, I reminded those present that one of the names of Jesus we remember at that season is 'Emmanuel' which means God with us. The essence of the Christmas story is that God came to live with us and experienced human life in all is joy, all its sadness all its messiness. God in Jesus experienced everything that could be known about human existence. As we move on from Christmas into the New Year it is encouraging to know that just as the shepherds and Wise Men searched for the baby at Bethlehem, Jesus can still be found by those who look for him. God in Jesus can be our companion and guide through the days, weeks and months of the New Year.

Looking ahead to 2021 there are still many uncertainties although, with the Brexit deal having been achieved and, as I write this piece, the Oxford Astra Zeneca vaccine approved for use here, there is much to be hopeful about. If you keep a journal the first day of January provides a blank page where the story of your life begins a new chapter. Although we may still be feeling daunted about the weeks ahead, we can follow the advice of Martin Luther King, Junior - "Take the first step in faith. You don't have to see the whole staircase, just take the first step."

As we take those first steps into the New Year, remember that Emmanuel (God with us) is here to light and guide our path and encourage us as we journey on.

Keith Douglas Ridler Phd, BSc., MI Chart. Eng., MI Mech. Eng. Aged 76

From the age of 23 Keith was a consultant engineer who worked for P A Consultants in locations across the world until taking early retirement in 1993. He lived in High Legh from December 1980 and after retiring became involved with the local community. He was project manager for the Community Association. At St John's Church he helped build a stage, the war memorial and fitted a loft ladder in the Church room. For 12 years he organised fundraising quizzes for the church. He served on the Parish Council at one point as Chairman and advised the Primary School, where he was a Governor, when they were planning their garden. Keith had been confirmed at an early age but had lost his faith when working as an engineer. Six and a half years ago he found faith again and enjoyed his time spent at St John's services, parish lunches and other events.

Randle Brooks Aged 78 years

On Monday 7th December the funeral took place in St Lawrence Church, Over Peover, of Randle Brooks, owner of Peover Hall and the Tatton and Peover estates. The Revd Philip Robinson officiated, assisted by Revd Murray Aldridge Collins the Vicar of the Parish of Over Peover. The previous day, residents of Rostherne, Ashley and other villages stood at the roadside to pay their respects as the cortege passed by on its way from Arden House to Over Peover. After a short service to receive Mr Brooks into St Lawrence Church, the church remained open so that individuals could pay their respects.

The late Mr Brooks was highly respected in this and other local communities. An expert on the history of Cheshire and its country houses, with his father and wife Juliet he restored Peover Hall from a state of near dereliction to how it would have been in 1585 when it was the home of the Mainwaring family. His stewardship of his estates extended to include a keen interest in the local communities. As a dedicated conservationist and historian he provided premises for Knutsford Heritage Centre and most recently, with his daughter-in-law and a group of volunteers from Rostherne, renovated the Egerton Hall in that village to be a hub for community activities.

CRIME IN THE VILLAGE

Little Bollington has seen a number of disturbing incidents in recent months. Travellers once again made unauthorised occupation of land by the old Nags Head. Action was taken promptly and they departed after a few days. A mystery marker was placed on a house in Park View causing fears of a possible intended crime. Fortunately this was seen and removed and no harm was caused. More recently night time intruders set about stealing expensive grass mowers from the outhouse of a property on Park Lane. They were interrupted by an alert dog and they fled. In another incident, cars were seen loitering for long periods late at night on Spode Green Lane. Again they were disturbed by residents and immediately departed. Please be alert and report any suspicious incident to the police.

HEDGE LAYING

The village was invaded by a more friendly force in November / December when Trafford Conservation Volunteers undertook a project in the village. They worked over several weeks at laying (or "layering") the hedge on Wharf Lane (see below). Hedge laying is the process of bending and partially cutting (pleaching) through the stems of a line of shrubs or small trees near ground level and arching the stems without breaking them, so they can grow horizontally and be intertwined. Laying a hedge promotes new growth from the ground keeping it healthy and thick for years to come.

Layered hedges are better able to regenerate and extend their life. They are excellent for wildlife, providing food for small mammals and birds and sources for pollinators. Many invertebrates feed on common native hedge plants. Bees, moths and butterflies enjoy hawthorn blossom and the autumn berries as well as summer flowering hedgerow shrubs like roses and honeysuckle. Some insects lay their eggs on hedge plants to overwinter. Managing hedges through laying and trimming, rather than flailing, keeps these vital resources intact.

Revd Philip's Favourite Sticky Toffee Pudding Recipe

Ingredients

50g (2oz) soft margarine or softened butter 175g (6oz) chopped dates 1 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda 175g (6oz) soft light or dark brown sugar

2 large eggs, beaten 175g (6oz) self-raising flour 1 teaspoon vanilla essence Tip: easy to make this gluten-free. Use g/f flour, check chopped date packet and bicarbonate of soda — most are gluten-free.

Method

Set oven to 180C/350F/Gas 4 and grease a 23cm (9") square baking tin (you can also line the bottom of the tin with baking paper)

Place dates in a pan with 300ml (1/2 pint) water. Bring to the boil, then simmer for about 3-4 minutes remove from the heat and stir in the bicarbonate of soda.

Place the margarine or butter in a bowl and beat together. Gradually add the eggs beating everything thoroughly. Add the vanilla essence.

Stir in the date mixture and flour. Then pour into the tin, levelling if necessary.

Bake in the oven for between 30 and 40 minutes until firm when you touch it.

For the Sauce

75g (3oz) Margarine or butter 300 ml (1/2 pint) double cream 110g (4oz) soft light brown sugar 2 teaspoons black treacle Tip: if you haven't any treacle use dark soft brown sugar in the sauce instead.

Put all the ingredients in a pan and stir as you bring the mixture to the boil. Simmer over a low heat for 2 minutes.

Serve the pudding cut into squares with the sauce poured over. Very tasty with cream, ice cream or custard on the side.


